However, the Lord intervened, giving me grace in the eyes of the leadership who provided unexpected support. In fact, today, I was informed that the ministry at the other school, where I teach Bible club, was also called into question by a church group who had complained both to the teachers and to the headmaster. Once again, the Lord intervened. A teacher surprisingly stood up for the Bible Club, supporting the fact that we taught only the Bible, not any church traditions. She later told me she likes the lessons that are taught, and said, "That church isn't here to teach and you are!"

While there definitely have been spiritual struggles and successes, there has also been a whole other aspect of missionary life: mundane maintenance! I've already lost count of the hours I've spent in different offices this year sorting issues with paperwork from maintaining my status here to keeping my phone line active, doing paperwork for my apartment, and even vehicle maintenance. I am extremely grateful that although these processes are often long and drawn out, they do not present any real uncertainty of reapproval. Usually it just takes a lot of patience and persistence.

May the Lord continue to be your Shield through your spiritual battles!
